In the next few days, with the help of Blaize & Lindsay Clark from Spiritwood Greenhouse I will have my orchard lot planted with flowers. This would not be possible without their help. I completely realize that the prices here are higher than some other places but without them we would not have a greenhouse here at all. All profits from operating the Shell Lake Greenhouse go toward flowers for my orchard lot from which we all benefit. As well, when you buy your plants locally not only are you saving gas and helping to make Shell Lake more beautiful you are helping to create a community space for visiting friends both new and old. In the broader context, supporting our local businesses is the only way to build for our common future, not only is it a more pleasant place to live but absolutely everyone's property values are completely dependent on successful local businesses. It is the local businesses who are

building this village, the businesses from afar do virtually nothing for Shell Lake. With struggling businesses, neglected lots and dilapidated buildings no one would be even remotely interested in coming to make a home here or in many cases even want to shop or even visit.


